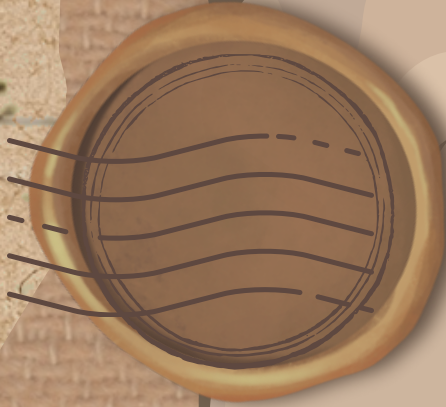

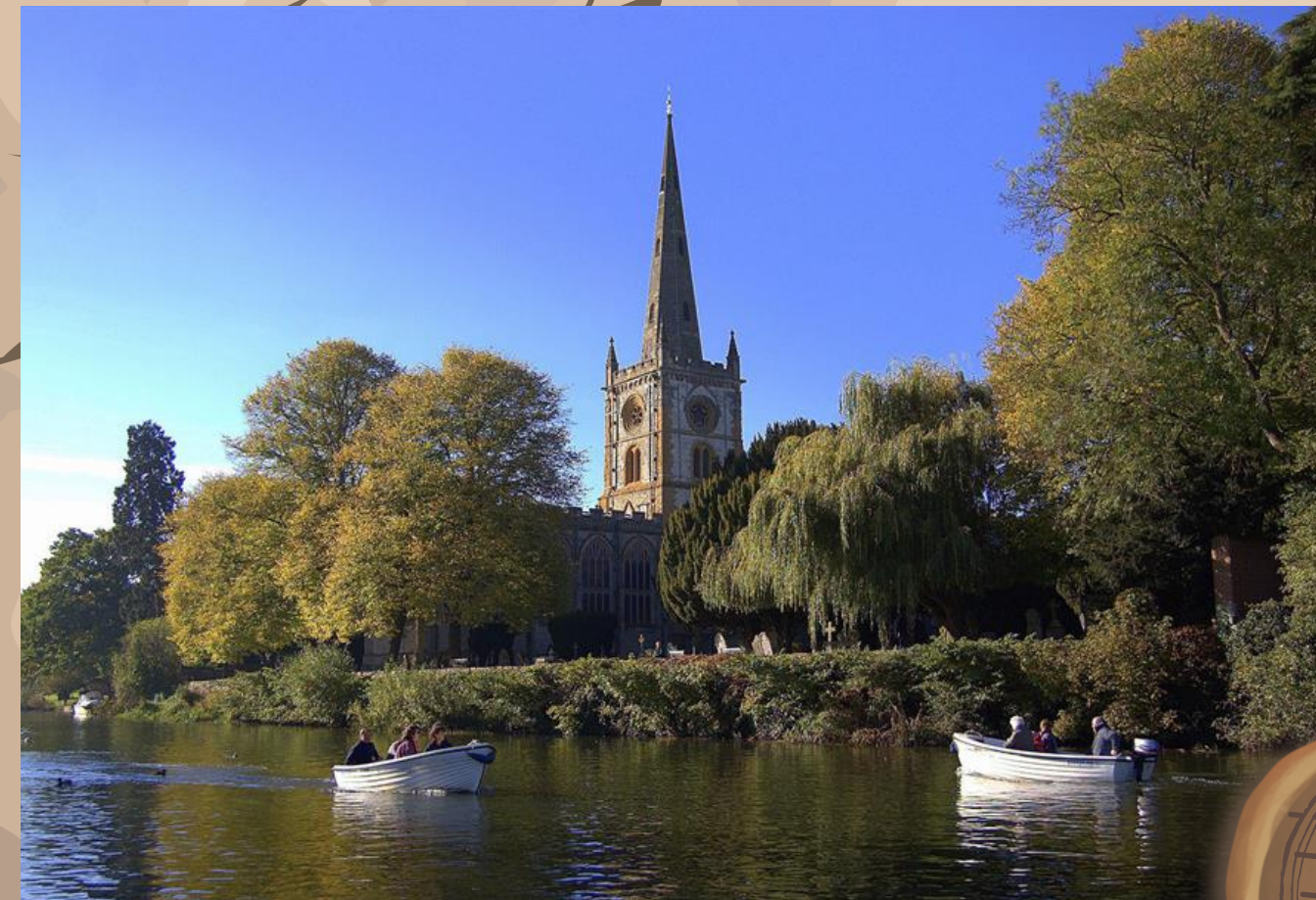

Royal Shakespeare Theatre
